

Arthur Collins

Arthur Collins was introduced to the sport of Schutzhund in 1984 while serving in the US Army in Germany. Arthur served 25 years in the US Military with 7 of those years stationed in Germany. He began his training in Germany as a helper and then as a dog trainer.

Upon his return to the United States in 1990, Arthur joined USCA and was a co-founder of the "Fayetteville Schutzhund Club". Arthur has been training director and held office in the FSC for many years. Under his direction the club hosts 2 club trials and helper seminar/classifications annually. Under Arthur's direction The Fayetteville SchH Club was also the host for the 2005 and 2014 SE Regional Conformation Show, the 2006, 2010, 2018 and the 2024 SE Regional Schutzhund Championship and the 2005 and 2007 North American (USCA Working Dog Championship).

Arthur had held the position of SE Regional Director or Assistant Regional Director from 2004 until 2015.

As a National Level Helper and Teaching Helper Arthur has assisted many new helpers receive their initial classification and assisted classified helpers in increasing their classification level. Arthur is also a Classified Tracklayer.

Arthur has titled several dogs and attended many trials as a competitor, helper, track layer and coach to other competitors. Though he spends much of his time assisting others to reach their goals in the sport he is still very involved as a handler. Since receiving his USCA Probationary Judge's License in 2014 and his permanent USCA performance/trial Judge's license in 2016, Arthur has judged numerous trials all over the United States and in Canada.
